



# PROJECT SERVICE TO OTHERS

## DISTRICT 20

(Revised, July, 2010)

Project - Service to Others is a Provincial RTO/ERO program which provides grants to districts for initiatives which support the concept of "Service to Others". Its intent is to raise the profile of retired teachers by visibly demonstrating to active teachers and to the public at-large that retired teachers care about their communities and about public education, and are willing to do something to help those who need assistance. These assistance projects could be in any form that supports the goals of Project - Service to Others as outlined below. *District 20, RTO/ERO has adapted this program to meet local objectives, In doing so, it espouses the same goals as the provincial project.*

### **What are the Goals of Project - Service to Others?**

- To provide financial assistance to education-related and other community projects;
- To facilitate member participation in education and community assistance projects;
- To help serve the educational and other needs of the disadvantaged in the community;
- To promote District participation in local, provincial and overseas educational or community projects;
- To raise the profile of retired teachers and of RTO/ERO;
- To show the general public that retired teachers continue to serve after retirement;
- To demonstrate to potential RTO/ERO members (active teachers) that RTO/ERO is a dynamic organization to which they should consider belonging when they retire from active teaching.

### **How Does It Work?**

District 20 has earmarked \$6,000 annually for local Service to Others projects. The District Executive will select projects to a maximum of \$2,000 for each of the counties in District 20, Frontenac, Lennox and Addington, Leeds and Grenville. While the maximum grant is \$2,000 per area, the Executive may select one or more projects whose total value is \$1,000, with no project receiving more than \$1,000.

Individual or groups may apply to the District 20 Secretary for funding. Please complete the information requested in order to enable the District Executive to make a decision.

Successful applicants must submit a written report at the conclusion of the project for publication in Vision 20/20. Photos and newspaper articles would be additional assets in publicizing the initiative.

**Applications must be submitted by October 31 in order to be considered for funding each year. The successful applicants will be notified after the November meeting of the Executive Board.**
